

Message from the Editor

In welcoming the new year, we can. at the very least, contemplate the past year with the idea of continuing the good and also consider the possibilities of change. This also applies to our individual involvement as Ahepans and what we can do for a better future. With this in mind, I would like to present the following comments made by James Zaflros in reference to strengthening, Ahepa membership:

"Analytical date shows the Order of Ahepa is still the backbone of the Hellenic American Community even though it's domestic membership has been in decline for some time. Ahepa is not alone, as other organizations have experienced similar declines. It is not that these organizations have changed, but America as changed. Moreover, in spite of aggressive efforts to initiate new members, the issue is not recruitment but retention. Today, potential members are constrained by lack of time. In addition, they may not see much in an organization whose prestige and vitality have declined.

The decline of Ahepa's domestic membership has forced Ahepa to develop and expand the brand in new markets, like Europe, to make up for the loss of revenue, image and prestige. Also, we need to understand what makes organizations flourish and what makes them languish. Social economic factors, including mixed marriages, divorces, newfound wealth and time management have impacted all social organizations.

The Greek-American and Philhellene of today are more likely to be considerably more successful, resourceful and better-educated with advanced degrees than their Ahepa counterparts of previous generations. While their priorities remain family, career and education, status has entered into the equation of lifting their image. They seek association and recognition with leading members of their community. They want their children exposed to a better social environment so they can interact and network with people, not necessarily of their own ethnicity, and this accounts for the large numbers of mixed marriages.

This generation's Ahepan's seek upscale, social, diverse and economic mobility in an effort to achieve their goals. Many have left Ahepa and have joined other organizations in their attempt to achieve success.

It is not enough to simply rely on routine monthly meetings, distribution of scholarships or the next philanthropic project to rise to the occasion. Ahepa has the built-in advantage of being and "American" grass roots organization, but it needs to reinvent its performance on an ongoing basis and it has to focus its attention in its own backyard. This would appeal to the ever increasing numbers of Philhellenes, who are becoming members and even leaders in their chapters.

Some Ahepa chapters are consciously aware of these socioeconomic factors and are more likely to succeed. Signature events like Career Days, Legend Tributes, Supporting Wounded Warriors, nation-wide Ahepa Housing, guest speakers and involvement and co-sponsoring community events, certainly help to fill their calendars. That's what the "A" in Ahepa stands for and leads the way for tomorrow's growth".







The Ramapo Ahepa chapter has been very busy for the first part of the year. Membership continues to grow as we initiated 8 new members – 4 each in October and November:






Trenton Ahepa #72 Sponsors and Participates in Jingle All the Way 3K event for Special Olympics of NJ






