
Message From The Chairman of the Board Lee J. Millas, Ahepa Board of Trustees





Cancer Foundation Texas Holdem Tournament A Success


ENCORE EVENT WILL BE HELD FEBRUARY 11TH



On Sunday October 8th the chapter hosted coffee hour following Sunday church services and showed the film "The 11th of May", a documentary on the invasion Crete in 1941.





ODYSSEY GREEK IMMERSION CHARTER SCHOOL



The Odyssey Greek Immersion Charter School in Delaware, the first such school to be sponsored by an AHEPA Chapter, has begun and is doing very well. It is the sixth Greek Immersion Charter school in the country. It is an elementary school from K to 5th grade at its maturity. The first year started with full-time Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd grades and each year will be adding a grade until the 5th grade is completed.

The school has now about 130 students with plans to reach about 300 at its mature year. At this time, the school rents a large building, formerly owned by the DuPont Company which was remodeled to have all the facilities of a modern American School. To do this, in addition to the AHEPA sponsorship, a number of prominent residents and foundations have contributed (see website for more specifics) HYPERLINK "http://www.odysseycharterschooldel.org/" http://www.odysseycharterschooldel.org/

For those of you who may not be familiar with the essence of Charter schools, they are public schools but privately run. This is an effort to allow privatization with its market forces to improve US education. As such, the state provides finances equivalent to the cost for educating a child in that school district. In addition, the Federal Government provides some start up assistance. The Ministry of Education of Greece, by parliamentary law, provides some Greek teachers to jump start the Greek Immersion Charter schools.

The school is comprised of a school board consisting of nine members, five of whom will always be AHEPANS. At this time, the school has seven teachers for the American curriculum and five teachers for the Greek curriculum. One of the teachers has special education capability as well. In addition, the school has a full-time nurse, a part-time student counselor and a Headmaster, brother AHEPAN, Anthony Skoutelas. Volunteer worker and brother AHEPAN George Righos can be found working there most of the time! The President of the school board and brother Ahepan, George Chambers has been the driving force from the school's inception, providing direction and leadership in helping Odyssey to attain its mission and vision.

The school's curriculum follows the core standards of the State of Delaware and the school is strongly advised by the State Department of Education, while working under the auspices of its chartering authority, the Red Clay Consolidated School District. The school emphasizes language and mathematics in its charter and curriculum and is working

to meet or surpass the State's standards. Two of the Greek teachers specialize in Music and Physical Education, with an additional focus upon movement and traditional Greek Dancing. Thus, the school provides extra dimensions to the overall curriculum, versus typical schools, and these teachers reinforce the learning of Greek language and culture. Up to 2 1/2 hours of daily instruction is devoted in Greek to language, culture and math

Visitors to the school and its classrooms are amazed at the quality of work being done and the enthusiasm that prevails. Children already respond in Greek and, above all, they seem to enjoy their Greek knowledge, using it with their classmates and teaching their parents at home. And we are talking about mostly children who have no previous connection with Greek culture. It is a sight to be seen and imitated by our Greek-American children. We hope so. Genoito!

In June, during the opening ceremonies of the Odyssey school, all the hierarchy of the state of Delaware, from the U.S. Senate, the Governor's office, the Assembly, the School District, the City Mayor, and the local community were present or represented. We were honored, of course, by the presence of AHEPA officers from the 5th District, brother Governor Ted Vittas, and the Supreme Lodge by brother Supreme President Gus James, along with other AHEPA dignitaries from both the District as well as the Supreme Lodge.


In Memory of two Great Ahepans



The honor was awarded during the District Five Convention in Tinton Falls, New Jersey.




AHEPA Meets with P.M. Karamanlis








In an author's note, Lasky explains that since there is little extant documentation pertaining to Eratosthenes himself, her job as historian became to "responsibly imagine based on what we already know". For ages 6-10, this book is an excellent for library donations.


Our second selection is I Have an Olive Tree written by Eve Bunting and illustrated by Karen Barbour. This book is a testimony to the wondrous ties of family and heritage. We consider our third selection the Greek Betty Crocker cookbook. It is Cooking the Greek Way. This cookbook is beautifully illustrated and is a basic Greek cookbook for young and old alike. 


Put On Your Sneakers! IT IS TIME TO GET YOUR GAME IN SHAPE.


THOMAS A. EDISON # 287 AHEPAN OF THE YEAR - 2006





The Cause of Turkey's Cyprus Problem Is Turkey

t isn't the case that progress in the Cyprus problem was prevented by the Greek Cypriot vote against the Annan Plan ("Turkey's EU Bid Quietly Loses Steam," Politics & Economics, Nov. 2). The United Nations settlement plan was turned down in a free and democratically held referendum. One doesn't need to elaborate further on what the right to vote means, in terms of democracy.


The Cyprus problem pre-existed the 2004 referendum and its continuation for the past 32 years is due to the Turkish occupation of one-third of the territory of the Republic of Cyprus. It is true that the Cyprus problem, which constitutes a serious breach of international law, is a continuous obstacle in Turkey's path toward Europe that only Turkey can remove.

Cyprus exercises its rights as a full member of the European Union constructively and responsibly and one shouldn't forget that Turkey owes the opening of its accession talks with the EU to Cyprus's good will. On the other hand, the government of the Republic of Cyprus has every legitimate right to do whatever possible in order to protect the sovereignty, legal personality and territorial integrity of the state that is undermined by Turkey's acts of aggression.

The hard situation in the northern part of Cyprus is a consequence of the Turkish invasion and subsequent occupation of that area. An invitation in 1997 by the then Cyprus President Glafcos Clerides to the Turkish Cypriot community to participate in a common EU accession negotiating team was turned down by Turkey and the Turkish Cypriots. Obviously their interest lies not in the economic development of the Turkish Cypriots but rather in their longstanding political objective of recognition of the secessionist entity by the inter-

national community.

Furthermore, there can be no link between Turkey's obligations toward the EU, including the opening of its ports and airports to the Republic of Cyprus, with that of other Turkish political demands regarding the solution of the Cyprus problem.


